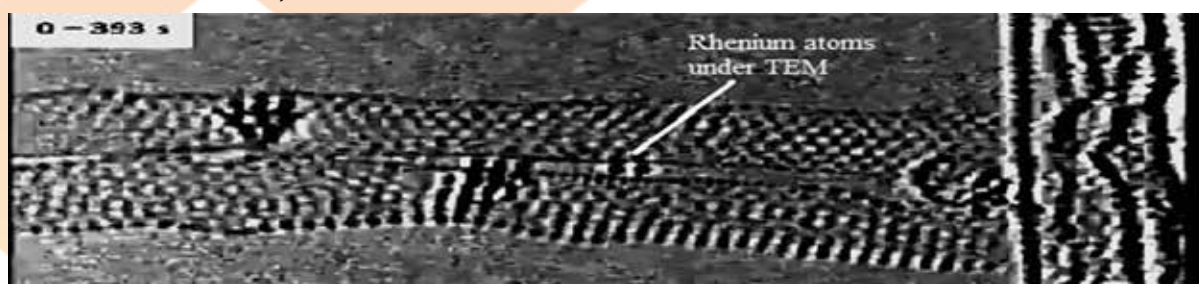
Scientists record first video of atoms forming and breaking chemical bonds

The first ever footage of atoms bonding and breaking has been captured by scientists from UK's Nottingham University and The University of Ulm in Germany using Transmission Electron Microscope (TEM). The process of atom forming bond is fundamental to every existing thing in the universe. It happens at such a minute scale that the technology to capture it did not exist prior to this. The video shows two Rhenium atoms between 0.1 to 0.3 nanometers in diameter, forming and breaking chemical bonds, inside a carbon nanotube. The two Rhenium atoms, used in the video, were trapped by the researchers inside narrow carbon nanotube. By a stroke of luck, one of the molecules escaped and wedged itself into a gap between two nanotubes and this caused the bond between the atoms to break completely, before eventually reforming again. Rhenium(Re) is a silvery- white heavy metal, has a very high atomic number(75), making it more visible in the TEM as compared to others. When the two atoms bond in the video, they stretch and deform from circular to oval shapes, while vibrating intensely. When the bond breaks, the vibration and distortion stops. The electron microscope, which recorded the bonding, also pushed the atoms to bond by providing them energy. With this technology, scientists hope to observe the formation of bonds and behavior of atoms in varied settings to better understand atomic mechanisms.

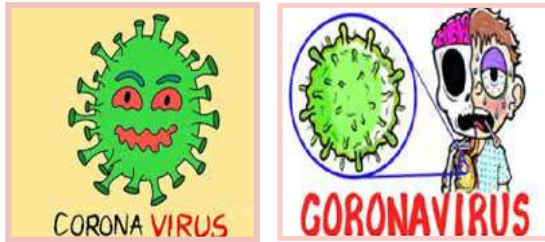

CORONA- THE DEADLY VIRUS

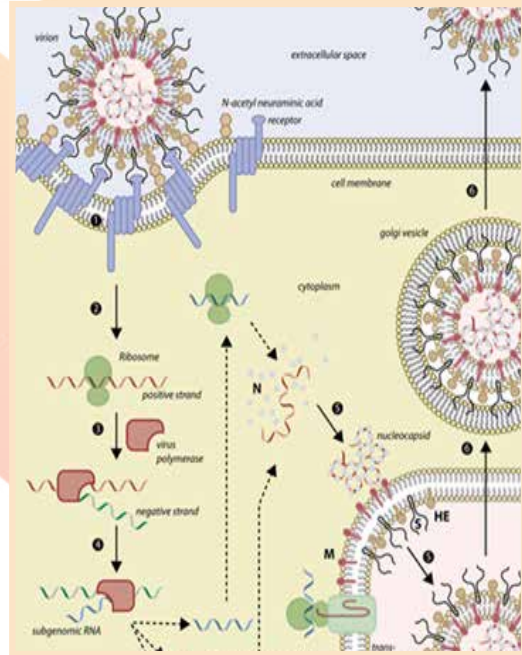


The term Coronavirus may have initially been unfamiliar to many, these viruses are a large family of virus that have a positive sense single strand RNA genome with a nucleocapsid of helical symmetry and spiky projections that resemble the points of a 'crown'(Latin: Corona).These viruses have a round core shrouded in protein & a greasy membrane that can infect birds & mammals.

Human Coronaviruses were 1st identified in mid 1960's.The 7 viruses that can affect people are: Common Human Coronavirus- 229 E, NL 63,OC 43,HKU 1 that utilize humans as 'Natural Hosts' & other Corona viruses- MERS-CoV, SARS-CoV & SARS-CoV2.These virus can be transmitted between humans through aerosols(respiratory droplets)that infected people expel when they breathe,cough or sneeze.The symptoms may usually start with a runny nose, headache,cough,sore throat and may proceed to fever.However MERS-CoV has the highest mortality rate at 30-40%.

The Corona viral infection is usually transmitted through 'AEROSOLS'. Replication of the Corona virus begins with the entry into the cell i.e. when the spikes of the virus engages with the host receptor that takes place in the cytoplasm. After its entry into the cell, the virus particle is uncoated & a cascade of reactions is triggered, resulting in merger of the virus with the cell. This merger allows the virus to release its genetic material & hijack the cell's machinery,churning out new progeny virions. polyadenylated tail, that allows RNA to

attach to the host cell's ribosome for translation. Infection by different Coronavirus may cause Inflammation,alter immune & stress response& modify coagulation pathways.



Thus Corona viruses possess the ability to correct genetic errors, especially those that are prone to mutation: those that encode spike proteins and accessory proteins, they manage to bind to new receptors and evade the immune response of new systems which is why they are good at jumping from species to species & termed as DEADLY.
